













The route's starting point is located within the medieval walls of Korčula, with the first seal in the Church of Our Lady, next to the Cathedral of St. Mark.

A tour of the Korčula route is recommended for a stay of 7 days or more to experience the unique features of the island's places and cultural, sacral and natural heritage.

To make it easier to navigate the island, the Camino Korčula is marked with recognizable blue-yellow signs.

Pilgrims who complete the Camino Korčula route will receive a pilgrim certificate or Compostela (available at the Korčula Tourist Office or Vela Luka Tourist Office).

Obtain a pilgrim passport or Credential del Peregrino online: https://crocaminoshop.com/.

The pilgrim passport is an official document of the completed pilgrimage, which records the stamps or credentials of the places (and landmarks) through which the Camino Korčula route passes, which are placed in customized and always accessible marked metal boxes along the route.

The stamps are not souvenirs, so please leave them for the pilgrims who come after you.

Useful Information

TIPS


- In summer, set off early in the morning to avoid the heat.
- Adjust your clothing to the season.
- Choose sturdy and comfortable shoes suitable for longer walks.
- Be sure to bring protection from the sun, rain and wind: a windbreaker jacket, a hat or cap, sunglasses.
- Bring at least 4 litres of water per section and dry food such as energy bars, chocolate bars, dried fruits, etc.
- Bring your personal identification document and a health card.
- Walk the trails in groups (at least two people).
- Bring a cell phone, knife, and mini first-aid kit (plasters), a map (printed or download the GPS file from the website: https://caminocroatia.com/camino-korcula/.


- Follow the trails marked with the Camino logo (blue background and yellow arrow). You will also come across other signs along the route.
- Gates that you find closed must be closed behind you.
- Please be advised that you set off on the Camino Korčula route at your own responsibility.
- In case of an accident or emergency, call 112.



IT IS FORBIDEN

- Camping in open areas outside of registered campsites.
- Leaving litter on the trails.
- Picking herbs, figs, grapes, etc.
- Making a fire.
- Hunting or disturbing animals, insects and birds, demolishing and jumping over dry stone walls.
